

HelpKidzLearn is a subscription based website that includes games and activities that are designed for either eye gaze, switch, mouse and keyboard or direct touch access. The software is split into five sections:

Early Years, Games, Stories, Creative and Find Out About.

There are activities to suit different skill levels including cause and effect, errorless choice making and timing skills.



Several different subscription options are available including free user (limited to 10 activities), 1 user, 5 user and Site License.

Rockets	The student uses eye gaze to select one of three rocket ships which starts a countdown from 5 to 0 countdown. Within game settings select eye gaze access and adjust the dwell time.	Key 4a: Failure Free Choosing	ACMNA001a ACMNA002a

The student selects the correct number and image in a 1-5 number line to count up the number line and the song plays as reward Within game settings select eye gaze access and adjust the dwell time. Special Delivery	Match and sort shapes, colours and numbers in this multiple choice activity. Requires the student to look at an object to select and look at the destination (door) to drag and drop. Giant Mini Calculator	Calculator takes up the whole screen. The activity is not designed for eye gaze access but the large buttons make it accessible with mouse click using mouse emulation software. 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Music Solo	A musician appears in one of three cells. The student must pick the correct cell to make the musician play its instrument. Early Mouse Movements	Users look at one of the seven colour options on the side of the screen to select a colour. As they look around the screen the colour will follow in a line to create squiggles and swirls. Within game settings select eye gaze access.
